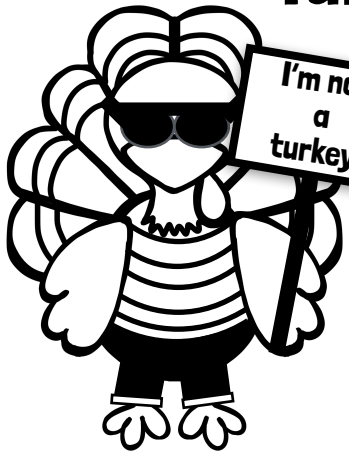

Optional: You can make your turkey sturdier by gluing him to a heavy weight paper or cardboard.

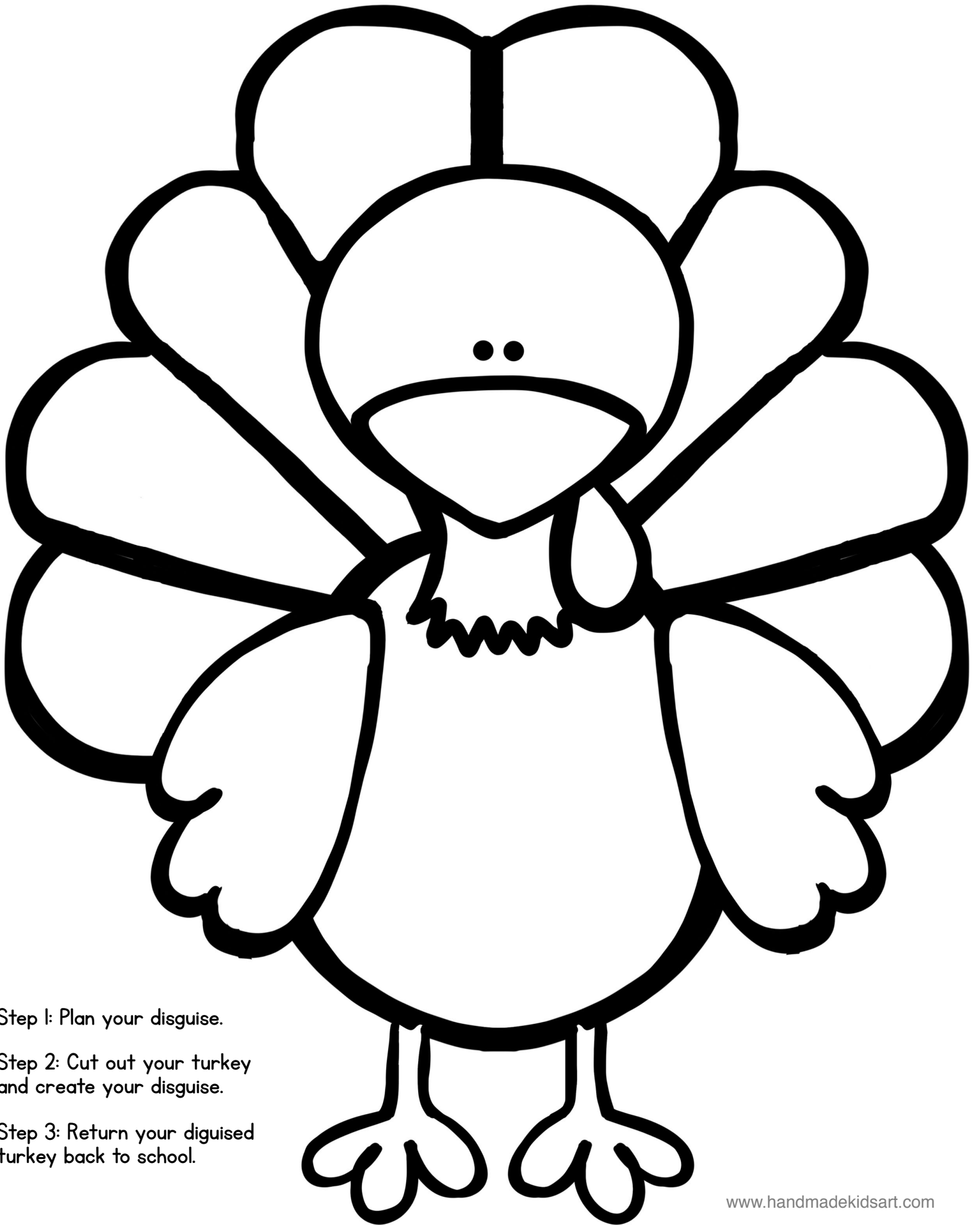
